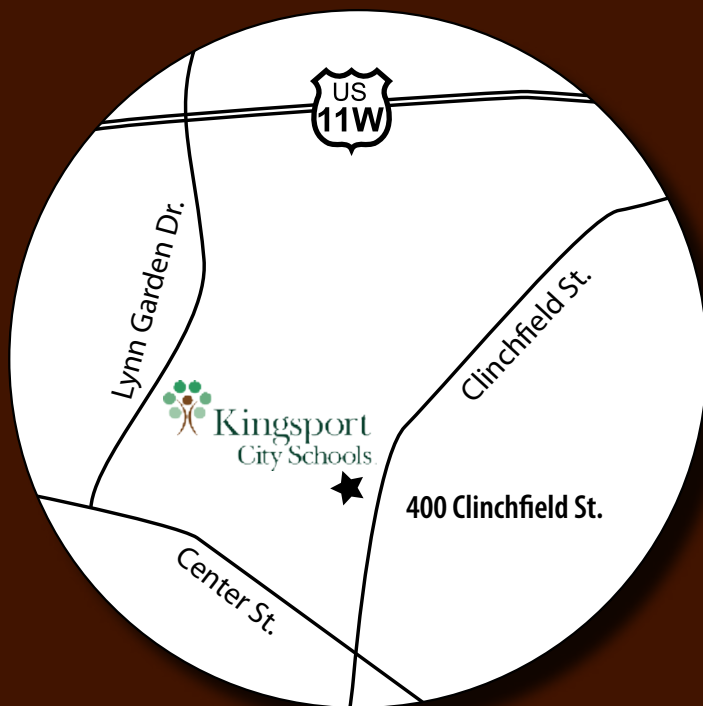

From Knoxville:

- Take I-40 E toward Asheville.
- Merge onto I-81 N via EXIT 421 on the left toward Bristol.
- Merge onto I-26 W/US-23 N via EXIT 57B toward Kingsport.
- Merge onto W Stone Dr/US-11W N/TN-1 via EXIT 1.
- Turn right onto Clinchfield St.
- 400 CLINCHFIELD ST is on the right.

From Asheville:

- Take I-26 W toward Weaverville (Crossing into Tennessee).
- Merge onto W Stone Dr/US-11W N/TN-1 via EXIT 1.
- Turn right onto Clinchfield St.
- Clinchfield St is 0.1 miles past Teasel Dr
- 400 CLINCHFIELD ST is on the right.

From Abingdon:

- Take I-81 S toward Bristol (Crossing into Tennessee).
- Merge onto US-11W S/TN-1 via EXIT 74B toward Kingsport.
- Turn left onto Clinchfield St.
- 400 CLINCHFIELD ST is on the right.
